

Microsoft Access – Allow Zero Length



Allow Zero Length

This property only applies to text fields. When this property is set to **Yes**, you can enter zero-length strings in a field. A zero-length string contains no characters. You use it to indicate that you know no value exists for a field, so that when you query the data you can separate between not knowing if the data exists and knowing that there is no data.

You enter a zero-length string by typing two double quotation marks with no space between them (“”).
